

The Women's March event will take place on the Cambridge Common on Saturday from 1:00 - 3:00 pm. Everyone is welcome to attend including families and people with disabilities. If it's similar to last year's event, many people will be wearing pink hats, and carrying or wearing interesting signs. Be creative. As previously published, those who would like to carpool to the event should **meet at First Parish at 11:30 am on Saturday morning**. Carpools will drive in and park at Alewife station, and then we will ride the T to Harvard Square station. If we can't get into Alewife to park, carpools are on their own for getting to the event.

Carpool drivers and riders should agree on a time and meeting place after the event in case people get separated, which is likely. If you parked at Alewife, we suggest Dunkin Donuts at Alewife Station by 3:45 pm. It's also a good idea to exchange cell phone numbers. However, at the Boston Women's March last year there were so many people that cell phones were not working for calls or texts.

When we get to Harvard Square we will meet up with others from First Parish by 12:45 at the St. Johns Memorial Chapel, Episcopal Divinity School, **[87-93 Brattle St, Cambridge](#)** (corner of Brattle and Mason streets) and walk as a group to Cambridge Common for the event.
