MUUsings

The sweet June days are come again, once more the glad earth yields Its golden wealth of rip'ning grain, and breath of clover fields, And deep'ning shade of summer woods, and glow of summer air, And winging thoughts and happy moods of love and joy and prayer.

—Samuel Longfellow, 1819-1892



All beautiful the march of days as seasons come and go;
The hand that shaped the rose hath wrought the crystal of the snow;
Hath sent the hoary frost of heaven, the flowing waters sealed,
And laid a silent loveliness on hill and wood and field.
—Frances Whitmarsh Wile. 1878-1939

The opening stanzas of these poems elicit a variety of responses. Those attuned to the rhythms of the seasons might think of the summer and winter solstice. Those who notice the rhythm of the verse will distinguish metrical similarities. Those who are musically minded might recognize two hymns in *Singing the Living Tradition:* No. 65, "The Sweet June Days," and No. 57, "All Beautiful the March of Days."

I love the seasonal symmetry of these two hymns. Surely, it is no accident that the winter and summer texts share a tune in our 1994 hymnal. Both are set to FOREST GREEN, an English folk melody harmonized by Ralph Vaughan Williams. This was not always so. Both texts appeared in the 1937 *Hymns of the Spirit* but were set to different tunes. They share FOREST GREEN for the first time in our 1964 hymnal *Hymns for the Celebration of Life*, balancing opposing seasons on a musical fulcrum.

I have superstitiously come to call "All Beautiful the March of Days" the "snow hymn." Generally, on December Sundays when we've sung the hymn, Mother Nature has provided the "white expanses" of snow described in the second verse, once or twice cancelling church altogether. By that same logic, I could call "The Sweet June Days" the "summer hymn." Longfellow's original title for the 1859 poem was "Summer Rural Gathering." We only sing it in June and it is definitely summer by the end of the month! What is true of both hymns is that they herald happy anticipation and acceptance of the new season.

O how our cup o'erbrims with good these happy summer days; For all the joys of field and wood we lift our song of praise."

May it be so for all of us this summer.



Howard and Fifi, using information gathered from the Standing Committee and from discussions with the congregation, are hard at work developing a budget that will address as many congregational priorities as possible, but the decisions will be difficult. The budget is scheduled to be approved by the Standing Committee at a special meeting on Sunday, June 5, at 6:00 p.m.


