Special Event with Climate Activist Craig Altemose Friday, October 25, from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m.

Save the date for a special event at First Parish with Craig Altemose, titled "The Climate Crisis: Why Only a Movement Can Save Us." Mr. Altemose, Executive Director of the Better Future Project, is the inspiring young activist leader of a strong climate action movement in Massachusetts. He became a climate activist after earning a law degree from Harvard Law School.
