A Mirror on Intolerance—Thursday, January 9 at 7:30 p.m.

Understanding and overcoming prejudice is something we all strive to do, however we are not always aware of how our culture reinforces those biases. This is especially true when we travel abroad and we experience situations of anti-Semitism, homophobia, ethnic intolerance or racism. On Thursday, January 9 at 7:30 p.m. in the Parish Hall, the Transylvania Partnership Community, the Diversity Committee and the Social Action Community are cosponsoring a panel discussion featuring the Rev. Harold Babcock, and others familiar with the complexities of Transylvania's many cultures. Rev. Babcock is the minister at the First Religious Society UU, Newburyport, the UUA's current ambassador to the Hungarian Unitarian Church's headquarters in Kolozsvar, and past President of the UU Partner Church Council.
