## **Conversation on the Death Penalty with Amnesty International** Group 15—Tuesday, March 25, 7:00 p.m. at the **Maynard Public Library**

Come join Amnesty International Group 15 for a conversation on the death penalty in the United States. Hear unique perspectives from Lawyer Johnson, a man who was exonerated after ten years on death row, and from Terry Kay Rockefeller, a woman whose sister was killed in the 9/11 attacks and who later founded September Eleventh Families for Peaceful Tomorrows. She testified at the death penalty trial of accused 9/11 coconspirator Zacarias Moussaoui. This event will be held in the Roosevelt Room at the Maynard Library.
