SAC Council's Challenge to Support Ebola Relief Efforts

After following the news about the spread of Ebola in West Africa for the past few months, the SAC Council has decided to give \$5,000 to Doctors without Borders, an organization with a history of providing assistance during disaster relief. DWB has been treating Ebola victims and trying to control the spread of the disease since the beginning of the outbreak. To date, at least 4,500 people in West Africa have died after contracting Ebola, and thousands more are expected to die from the disease in the next few months. The SAC Council is challenging the congregation to match its donation of \$5,000. During the plate collection next Sunday, you will have an opportunity to give what you can to help the congregation meet this goal. The SAC Council will also be reaching out to other local houses of worship to ask them to initiate similar challenges.
