At its General Assembly, in July 2014, the Unitarian Universalist Association passed a Business Resolution including strong encouragement for all UU congregations to consider divestment from fossil fuels or responsible shareholder activism. The Environmental Leadership Team's divestment subgroup is leading the congregation in learning about and discussing these issues. Come to this panel on November 16 to learn about the issues involved. Panelists will include: Donna Clifford, a financial advisor at Rainbow Solutions, Inc.; Rev. Dorothy Emerson, an ordained UU minister; and Peter Lowitt, cochair of the Environmental Leadership Team and GA 2014 attendee.

"One of the first freedom riders, an adviser to Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., organizer of the march on Washington, intelligent, gregarious and charismatic, Bayard Rustin was denied his place in the limelight for one reason—he was gay. This film contributes a fascinating new chapter to our understanding of both progressive movements, and gay life, in 20th-century America."
