Finding Meaning through Reflection in Later Life

This six-week program sponsored by First Parish's "First Tuesday Group (65+)" is based on the book *Lasting Words*, by Claire Willis, who led a Sunday Forum at First Parish this fall. The book focuses on spiritual issues of common concern, suggesting questions for reflection through discussion and writing. Coping With the Challenges of Caregiving Workshop Saturdays, February 21 and February 28, 1:00 – 3:00 p.m.

Providing care for a family member is an age-old act of kindness, love and loyalty. You may be caring for an aging parent, disabled spouse; or a child with a physical, mental or addiction disorder. With the right help and support, you can be a good caregiver without sacrificing yourself in the process. Please join others who are faced with this challenge, so that we may support each other and learn some valuable skills to help make the task a little easier. In this two-session workshop, (Saturdays, February 21 and February 28, 1:00 - 3:00 p.m.) participants will learn how to tame their own stress response; helping to control stressful caregiving situations before they arise by using a variety of cognitive (thinking/doing) approaches along with a number of intuitive (self-hypnosis, autosuggestion, and imagery conditioning) techniques. You'll learn how to disarm that part of the personality that triggers anger, frustration, resentment or any other health threatening response to stressful events, as well as how to reframe our view of events so that they become objective challenges rather than destructive distractions. Lou Fackert will facilitate the workshops. She has extensive experience in counseling, education and training, teaching emotionally disturbed children and teens, those with developmental disabilities, mental illness, addiction disorders and homelessness.
