### Searching for Extraterrestrial Life

Today's Forum is presented by Harvard astrophysicist Dr. Eric Chaisson, titled "Searching for ET—and What It Tells Us about Ourselves on Earth," at 11:30 a.m. in the Sanctuary. So far we have absolutely no evidence that life exists beyond Earth. But lack of contact with alien beings might actually comprise a null "signal," telling us something profound: Only solar energy (including wind, water and waves) can power our civilization going forward without soiling the environment with increased heat as global energy usage continues to increase. Survival of intelligent life on Earth, or anywhere else in the Universe, seems all about energy and timing.

Remembering Lincoln on the 150th Anniversary of His Death

Today, at 3 p.m., there will be a tribute to Abraham Lincoln at First Parish in memory of the 150th anniversary of his death. Rick Frese will deliver excerpts from Emerson's powerful eulogy. Polly Peterson and Richard Smith will share citizens' reactions to the loss of their President. Jacqueline Schwab will play selections of Civil War music, Brian Chenowith will officiate. Frese is the author of *Concord and the Civil War: From Walden Pond to the Gettysburg Front.* Peterson is a researcher, speaker and author of *Stirring the Nation's Heart: Eighteen Stories of Prophetic Unitarians and Universalists of the Nineteenth Century.* Smith is a historian and interpreter of Henry David Thoreau. Schwab is a pianist who has performed on Ken Burns' documentaries, including the Grammy award-winning *Civil War.* She performed at the White House for President Clinton, and on *A Prairie Home Companion* and *David Letterman.* www.fptranscendentalism.org

### Rain Barrel Program 2015—Conserve Water and Save Money

This spring, the Social Action Community is selling rain barrels to help our community conserve water and save money. The barrel comes complete with overflow fittings, drain plug, screw-on cover, and a threaded spigot with a choice of two ports to use with either a watering can or a garden hose. Each barrel, \$75, comes in forest green, earth brown and Nantucket gray. Barrels will be available for pickup on Saturday, May 2, from 9 to 11 a.m. at First Parish. As part of our congregation's Blue Bucket Campaign, \$10 from the sale of each barrel will go to the UUSC's partner in Kenya to help get access to clean water.
