Deborah Jiang-Stein in Conversation with State Representative Cory Atkins—Saturday, May 2, 7:30 p.m. in the Parish Hall

Author of *Prison Baby* and founder of the unPrison Projects, Deborah was born in prison, and spent the first year of her life in solitary confinement with her mother, before being adopted into a middle-class Jewish family. Her realization of her beginning led to a tumultuous adolescence and beyond. She now travels around the United States to promote awareness of the issues surrounding women and incarceration. Proceeds will benefit the unPrison Project—her nonprofit that educates and empowers women in prison. Deborah will be interviewed by our own Representative, Cory Atkins, who has worked diligently to advocate for women. Tickets are \$10 available at coffee hours or at the door.

Twenty years ago, at age seventeen, when walking to a Teens Against Violence meeting, Louis Brown was killed, caught in the crossfire between two gangs. Tina responded to this horrific tragedy by creating a center for peace that provides hope through healing, teaching, and learning. The First Parish SAC Grants Committee has awarded three consecutive grants to the LDBPI in support of the PeaceZone Curriculum and the Leadership Academy.
