Americans for Economic Fairness Group Collecting Signatures Did you know? The richest households in Massachusetts (incomes over \$860,000) pay 6.5% of their income in state and local taxes, while the rest pay almost 10% (9.4%). Learn about a proposed amendment to the Massachusetts constitution that would raise taxes on incomes in excess of \$1 million to make these rates more equal and raise additional funds to be invested in education and infrastructure. Members of First Parish's Americans for Economic Fairness group will be at coffee hour for the next three weeks to

gather the signatures needed to put this on the state ballot.
