Communicating with Loves Ones about Veganism Friday, December 2; 7:00 p.m. in the Chapel

Please join the Reverence for Life committee for an evening with Dr. Casey Taft, Professor of Psychiatry at Boston University's School of Medicine, when he will speak about "Communicating with Loved Ones about Veganism." An internationally recognized researcher in the areas of trauma and the family, he has won prestigious awards from the International Society for Traumatic Stress Studies, the Institute on Violence, Abuse and Trauma, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Dr. Taft has consulted with the United Nations on preventing violence and abuse globally. He sees the prevention of violence toward animals as a natural extension of this work.
