Today, March 4, is the first Sunday to Share the Plate with Centro de Arte Para La Paz. El Centro is a local nonprofit recognized for its work with children, youth, and adults in the town of Suchitoto, El Salvador. It is a healing space, providing classes and workshops in art, music, photography, dance, and conflict mediation, all in a setting where the Civil War dominated the lives of families for more than 15 years. The center includes a museum within its walls for the preservation of historical memory, currently containing seven exhibits and visited by 7,000 per year. CAP's vision is the prevention of violence and creation of a culture of peace, serving over 1,350 students with classes and touching over 85 women/families every semester.
