This process has resulted in the Standing Committee crafting a new policy on spending to present for a vote at the annual meeting on June 10. Oriana Consort at First Parish, Reception Following Sunday, May 6, 5:00 p.m.

In this concert, Oriana presents beautiful but infrequently-performed choral works by several lesser-known composers. Sixteenth-century Swiss composer Ludwig Senfl gives us a sacred motet and a lively mimetic piece that sounds like bells in a cathedral tower. The first half ends with three small-ensemble choruses by Boston's own Amy Beach. The program ends with Gerald Finzi's sensitive choral settings of seven poems of Robert Bridges (later England's Poet Laureate).
