In this concert, Oriana presents beautiful but infrequently-performed choral works by several lesser-known composers. Sixteenth-century Swiss composer Ludwig Senfl gives us a sacred motet and a lively mimetic piece that sounds like bells in a cathedral tower. The first half ends with three small-ensemble choruses by Boston's own Amy Beach. The program ends with Gerald Finzi's sensitive choral settings of seven poems of Robert Bridges (later England's Poet Laureate).

Our government's Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents are grabbing them when they come in for their regular reporting to ICE. They are being required to pay for their plane ticket back to a country they may barely remember. We will walk peaceably around the ICE building. With signs, with singing, with chanting.
