## May's Share-the-Plate Recipient

May's Share-the-Plate recipient is CityReach, an overnight urban outreach program for youth, young adults, and college students from churches of any denomination. The program gives these young people the opportunity to learn first-hand about homelessness from people who have experienced it. During the 20-hour session, participants join CityReach staff in street ministry and offer hospitality, food, and clothing. This is followed by times of sharing and reflection. CityReach is a ministry of Common Cathedral (Ecclesia Ministries, Inc.), an outdoor congregation, housed and unhoused, sharing God's love through community, pastoral care, creative expression, and worship on Boston Common.
