The Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival

Supported by both the UUA and the UU Ministers' Association, the Poor People's Campaign (PPC) is uniting tens of thousands of people across the country to challenge the evils of systemic racism, poverty, militarism, ecological devastation, voter suppression, immigrant rights, economic inequality, and the nation's distorted morality. Fossil fuel, chemical, and other industries have been allowed to poison our air, water, and land, contributing to an estimated 9 million premature deaths in 2015 worldwide. Rallies in Boston, 39 other state capitals, and Washington, D.C. started taking place concurrently on five consecutive Mondays in May. The theme for the rally on Monday, June 4, at 2:00 p.m. is "Ecological Devastation and Health."
