In 1985, villages were burning! People running! Genocide was happening in South Sudan. Sixteen thousand children ran for months to the relative safety of a refugee camp in Kenya. Those who did not survive died of starvation, animal predation, disease, and murder from the Northern Sudanese army. In 2000, 150 "Lost Boys" from Sudan came to the Boston area. The South Sudanese Enrichment was established to support these orphans as they acclimated to life in America. Some have done well and others struggle.
