Come meet the South Sudanese this Sunday at coffee hour! Currently they are immigrants, but once they were refugees from the genocide in South Sudan. They are survivors. Rachel Ater will speak at the service representing the South Sudanese Enrichment for Families as a Sharing the Plate recipient, Laper Kom, will sell African tablecloths and napkins and a former "Lost Boy" will be at the table to greet you. Please stop by the table to meet these courageous people and find out what the South Sudanese Enrichment for Families is doing to support the South Sudanese that live in the Boston area. The "Lost Boys and Girls" in Concord this Sunday

All the South Sudanese here in Boston are survivors of the genocide in South Sudan. The north attacked the South many times and for decades, but this genocide escalated in 1985. Because of this, many South Sudanese were forced to flee. The "Lost Boys" ran for months to the relative safety of refugee camps. Many others left before their villages were attacked: they went to Egypt or North Sudan itself. Life was not easy. In 2000, 150 "Lost Boys" and 5 "Lost Girls" were resettled in Boston. Their journey hasn't ended. During the last few years, many of the "boys" have gone back to South Sudan and have married. They have started families of their own in the Boston area. Helping your spouse and children acclimate to life in America is not easy. Resettling refugees is not a sprint; it is a marathon. We need your help to continue our work. (SSEFBoston.org).
