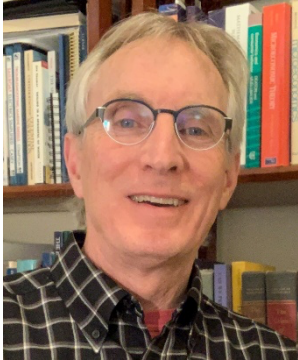


FIRST PARISH IN CONCORD
